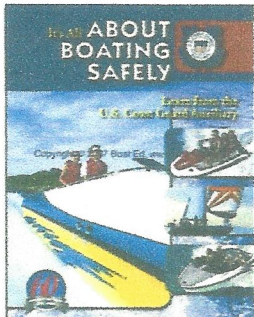

To operate a vessel powered by a motor of 10 HP or greater (including a PWC), a person who was born on or after Jan. 1, 1988, must have completed a boater education course approved by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators or passed an approved equivalency exam.

No one under the under 14 years of age may operate any PWC on Florida waters at any time, even if such person possesses a Boating Safety Education ID Card.
